In a complex world that is often unkind and dangerous to our most vulnerable children, Big Brothers Big Sisters is a ray of hope for a better life and future, for generations to come. Big Brothers Big Sisters is a donor-supported organization. We depend on the generosity of our community to serve the many at-risk youth referred to our program. As those referrals from teachers, counselors, youth workers, parents, and law enforcement come in, our waiting list grows. Right now, there are hundreds of children throughout San Juan County who are not yet matched with a "Big." Many have been waiting for over a year. Providing services to these children are critical, now more than ever.

Research tells us that Big Brothers Big Sisters is the single most effective way to help vulnerable boys and girls achieve success and reach their potential. Mentoring has a huge impact on a young person's positive development. Compared to other children their age, boys and girls who are matched with a Big Brother or Big Sister are:


- 46% less likely to begin using illegal drugs
- 27% less likely to begin using alcohol
- 52% less likely to skip school
- 40% less likely to get arrested
- 33% more confident in their school performance

Since our founding 35 years ago, Big Brothers Big Sisters has created fundamental, positive change in the lives of over 5,000 children. Our vision is that all children achieve success in life. We make this happen by creating lasting friendships that will change children's lives for the better, forever. This year, our staff will serve over 200 boys and girls in San Juan County.

We are dedicated to providing safe, professional, effective experiences to the children, families, and volunteers we serve. We are extremely lucky to have the leadership of an outstanding board of directors and the tireless commitment of top notch staff who manage our day-to-day operations. 2016 Youth Outcomes Survey

The Big Brothers Big Sisters Youth Outcomes Survey (YOS) is a real-time measure of the effectiveness of our programs. The YOS demonstrates depth and breadth of outcomes for our youth facing adversity in multiple areas of their lives. Below are the results of YOS showing the percentages of children improving or maintaining in the following areas:



Why We Measure?

- Social acceptance is associated with peer relations and conduct which are linked to higher grades and graduation rates.
- Self-reported grades are associated with actual grades which are linked to externalizing behaviors (males), internalizing behaviors (females), and high school graduation rates.
- Educational expectations are associated with hope for a higher education or educational success which is linked to academic achievement, high school graduation, and college attendance.
- Parental trust is associated with positive parental relationships which are linked to decreased risky behavior and better school performance.
- Perceived scholastic competence is associated with improved school performance which is linked to improved grades.
- Having a special adult in a child's life who is not a parent is associated with improved school attendance, attitudes toward school and parent trust which are linked to improved grades and decreased delinquency.
- Attitudes towards risk are associated with actual risky behaviors which are linked to negative outcomes later in life.
